

HERE'S WHAT YOU'LL DO:

- Participate in workshops, alumni panels, career fairs, and other programs to build your knowledge, experience, and network of contacts.
- Continue meetings with your *Gateway* counselor to refine your career or graduate study plan.
- Research opportunities of interest to you in various careers or areas of graduate study.
- Tap into Lafayette's network of successful alumni and parents to seek advice about industries or careers of interest.
- Take advantage of the Externship Program: One of the most important experiences you'll have is the opportunity to "shadow" a Lafayette graduate or parent for several days. This externship will enable you to observe the kinds of experience and skills you'll need on the job, explore career interests, and to make valuable connections with Lafayette alumni.


HERE'S WHAT YOU'LL DO:
